Christ Church Aughton is looking to recruit a Children and Young Peoples Worker to inspire and engage children and young people to worship pray and learn.

Christ Church is a parish church with an evangelical ministry set in the south part of the ancient market town of Ormskirk, 14 miles north of Liverpool on the West Lancashire plain. An Anglican church, we belong to the Diocese of Liverpool and are part of a cluster of five churches committed to LYCIG (Leading Your Church Into Growth). We have two Sunday morning services: a traditional 9.00am Holy Communion service and a 10:45am family service. There are currently 254 people on the Electoral Roll. Throughout the week there are many activities going on within the life of the Church, including Café Vista, morning prayer meetings, bumps and babes, toddlers' group, over-65s luncheon club, LYFE (Living Your Faith Everyday) groups, groups for women and men. Church members are active as providers of debt advice, food bank volunteers and school pastors. Through all these events and activities Christ Church seeks to be a strong presence in the community, as we continue to pray for the Church to grow and more people to know Jesus.

Our vision is that every person across our community can 'come as they are' and encounter Jesus. We aim to realise our vision by growing in our faith, as authentic disciples of Jesus, sharing God's love in practical ways in our community, and telling others about Jesus, so that they can know his love.

We are looking for a passionate and committed Children and Young Peoples worker to be responsibility for four key areas:

- 1. Providing pastoral support to children and young people within our church community.
